

Symphonic Band Recorded Assignments 2018-2019

Chromatic Scale

1. Record your name and your grade level.
2. Say: *"This is my F Concert Chromatic Scale."* Play your 2 octave concert F chromatic scale. All band members will play the F concert chromatic scale from the warm-up sheet.

Major or Minor Scales

1. Record your name and your grade level.
2. Play your major scales saying the name of each scale before you play it. Sophomores, and Juniors must record scales in the following order: concert Bb, Eb, Ab, Db, Gb/F#, Cb/B, E, A, D, G, C, F. Freshmen should record the following scales only: Bb, Eb, Ab, Db, C and F. You do not have to record all of the scales in one "take", but you do have to play them in order. If you need to skip a scale, say which scale you are skipping and go on. Do not come back to the scale later. Do not play the scales out of order. All scales should be played in quarter notes at tempo 120. Please use the articulation pattern "tongue two, then slur two." Seniors: Play Bb, Eb, Ab, Db, C, & F concert major scales then play g, c, f, b-flat, a, & d concert minor scales. All scales should be played in quarter notes at tempo 120. Please use the articulation pattern "tongue two, then slur two" pictured below for each scale.



Music Excerpts

1. Record your name and your grade level.
2. Say the name of the piece you are playing, what measure you are starting from, and what measure you are ending on.

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Assignments should be emailed directly to tdahlgren@seasidek12.org Files sent must have your name on the file (i.e. "Joe Smith Scales 2018"). You may record your assignment on your phone, but I cannot listen to them via your phone. Assignments must be sent in an email or shared via Google. If files are separated, make sure to label what scale(s) the file is (i.e. "B-flat concert")

If you are unable to record your assignments, you must play them for me live. Please set an appointment with me to play your assignment before the due date (early is good). Points are deducted for not following the recording procedures. Be sure to listen to your recording completely before turning in the assignment.
